### **Position Summary & Key Responsibilities**

CSF has adopted a system reform approach, with quality pedagogy at the center of it. We partner with state governments to design and scale effective foundational programs through a process of demonstration and consistent iteration. While many programs exist today, the foundation's effort is to work with the state to own a foundational program that is scalable, cost-effective and effective.

To this end, the Classroom Instruction Practices (CIP) team works on raising the quality of tools, training, & support available for teachers implementing foundational learning in the classroom. We collaborate with our program partners and state academic leadership to improve instructional design and program implementation. We also develop exemplar knowledge products (including teaching-learning standards, structured pedagogy tools, and teacher training modules) to set best-practice standards. We also engage with domain experts to generate rigorous evidence around specific issues in early learning.

This is an ambitious role entrusted with two core areas of contribution:

- 1. Manage program design & implementation** to improve foundational learning (pre-primary and early primary) across Indian states in collaboration with partners
  - a. Support diagnostics to assess the status-quo of foundational-learning quality in government schools and use insights to build salience in the state
  - b. Facilitate co-creation of instructional design of the intervention in collaboration with partners and the state
  - c. Manage program timelines and deliverables for effective implementation, creating timely and high-quality outputs and continuously resolving bottlenecks
  - d. Oversee program quality implementation in the field including teacher training, classroom implementation and academic support programs through field visits and classroom observations
  - e. Drive adoption of CSF knowledge products in states by piloting innovations within state programs
  
- 2. Partner management to strengthen supply-quality** by developing technical capacity of partners to provide effective early learning expertise to states
  - a. Improve CSF partners program quality by assessing programmatic readiness, process feedback and exposure to best practices
  - b. Influence CSF partners to adapt engagement models to adapt to the needs of state governments
